Projects approved by the Board of Directors of NSEIT Limited for the FY 2021-22

A common CSR function was created under NSE as a group resource for NSE and its subsidiaries falling under the purview of Section 135, with a common CSR policy, and the actual CSR spend proportionately allocated to the respective Companies.

The Corporate Social Responsibility Rules require CSR activities to be undertaken through a Section 8 company, a registered trust or a registered society, established by the company, either singly or along with any other company. Accordingly, NSE Foundation was incorporated on March 5, 2018, to converge the CSR efforts of NSE Group and all ongoing CSR projects were assigned to NSE Foundation to be implemented further. Under the supervision of its Board, NSE Foundation implements the CSR initiatives of NSE Group companies by partnering with local grass-root level organisations or with other agencies which have technical expertise.

The CSR Committees and Boards of various NSE Group companies which fall under the mandate of Section 135 of The Companies Act 2013, have approved that the Board of NSE Foundation may approve projects and take decisions that would enable the said companies to meet their CSR obligations. The NSE Foundation Board meets every quarter to review ongoing projects, approve new proposals etc. On a biannual basis, the CSR Committees and Boards of the respective NSE Group companies ratify the decisions of NSE Foundation Board, review the status of ongoing projects, approve new projects and receive updates on other events and activities.

The CSR Rules mandate an Annual Action Plan to be approved by the respective NSE Group CSR Committees and Boards. The annual action plan lays out the CSR projects to be undertaken during the course of the financial year. The plan shall also include amongst other things, details of the projects to be undertaken, the focus areas or subjects specified in Schedule VII of the Act, the manner of execution of such projects or programmes, the modalities of utilisation of funds, the implementation schedules, monitoring and reporting mechanism for the projects undertaken by the company.

The annual plan gives the details of the projects approved by the Board of Directors, proposed to be undertaken in FY 2021-22

Note:

COVID-19 relief activities- Due to the intensity of the second wave of COVID 19, additional programmes to mitigate the effects of COVID and prevent a third wave may be considered to be taken up by NSE Foundation. Some suggested activities are food relief and ration kits to deal with the humanitarian crisis, supply of small equipment such as Oxygen concentrators, Oxygen cylinder, ECG machines, ABG machine etc. and plants to provide oxygen in hospitals, vaccination awareness and facilitation to ensure maximum vaccine coverage in a given location. Given the urgency of the situation, the same may be approved by the Board of NSE Foundation and subsequently placed for ratification by the respective CSR Committees and Boards.

The annual action plan gives the approved projects proposed to be undertaken in FY 21-22. The Board, on recommendations of the CSR Committee, may alter the above annual plan and budget at any time during the financial year depending on various factors such as ground assessment, capacity of local partner agencies, natural disasters such as the COVID-19 pandemic, events beyond the control of the stakeholders etc. that necessitates course correction. In certain cases, the Board of NSE Foundation may evaluate a project for technical feasibility and suggest suitable changes to be made in the programme design and budget which may be ratified by the CSR Committees of the respective Companies and their Boards.

Further to fulfil the CSR obligations of NSE Group Companies falling under the mandate of Section 135, certain additional projects may be approved by the NSE Foundation Board. and the same may be brought back subsequently to the NSE CSR Committee and Board for ratification.

Need/Baseline Assessment: The empanelled PME agencies conduct due diligence of the project proposal which includes refinement of the programme methodology, optimisation of the cost etc. before recommending the proposal. For most projects, data is collected from secondary sources at the proposal stage. On approval of the project, baseline activities are conducted by the on-ground partner agency and refinement in programme implementation plan is incorporated.

Impact Assessment: Thirteen (13) projects across various core focus areas have concluded their programmatic activities in FY 20-21. Impact assessment for the projects have been initiated through independent assessment agencies, selected by a rigorous internal



process. Due to the COVID pandemic, there has been a delay in conducting field visits, direct interviews with beneficiaries and focus group discussion with the community and other stakeholders. The secondary desk reviews, collation of information through telephonic interviews etc. have commenced. The final report, when completed, will be placed before the Board.
